

Fall 2006 Community Notices

In separate incidents, 16 students were assigned **one point** for possession of an open container of alcohol in a public area.

In separate incidents, four students were assigned **one point** for being disruptive in a residence hall.

In separate incidents, 18 underage students were assigned **two points** for possession of alcohol.

A student who on two separate occasions was issued a summons by the Kirkland Police Department for an open container violation in the Village of Clinton was assigned **two points**.

A student who made an unauthorized room change and failed to comply when directed to move back to the original room was assigned **two points and will be the last person in their class to choose a room in the next housing lottery**.

A senior who was found responsible for an unauthorized room change was assigned **two points and required to move back to the original room**.

A student who was disruptive in a residence hall was assigned **two points**.

A student who continued to tamper with a construction vehicle when asked by a Campus Safety officer to stop was assigned **two points**.

In separate incidents, three students who failed to evacuate a building during a fire alarm were assigned **three points**.

In separate incidents, seven students were assigned **three points** for hosting a disruptive party with alcohol.

A student who was found responsible for an unauthorized room change was assigned **three points**.

Five students were held accountable for damage to the common area of their suite. Each student was assigned **three points**.

Four individual students who failed to correct fire safety violations were issued **four points**.

A student who hosted a party with alcohol where minors were served was assigned **four points**.

In separate incidents, three students found responsible for possession and use of marijuana were assigned **four points**.

In separate incidents, four students who were underage and in possession of alcohol and marijuana were assigned **five points**.

A student who destroyed a bulletin board in a residence hall was assigned **six points**.

A student who damaged a light fixture in a residence hall was assigned **six points and required to pay twice the cost of repair**.

A student who damaged a residence hall bathroom was assigned **six points and required to pay twice the cost of repair**.

A student who damaged window screens in a residence hall was assigned **six points and charged double the cost of repair**.

A student who was verbally abusive to a student employee was assigned **six points**.

A student who was smoking marijuana and refused to identify himself to Campus Safety was assigned **six points**.

A student who was verbally abusive to another student and who damaged college property was assigned **eight points**.

A student with **eight points from previous violations** was assigned **two points** for violating the alcohol policy and failure to comply with the request of a college official. The student was suspended for one semester.

In separate incidents, two students accepted responsibility for conduct that recklessly or intentionally threatens or endangers the health and safety of any person after consuming alcohol and driving a vehicle. Both students were **assigned ten points and suspended for two semesters**.

In separate incidents, two students who made an unauthorized room change were required to move back to the assigned room and will have their housing lottery number increased by 100.
