

TRUST TREAT CORE COMMITTEES
(Summary)

Core	Basic Responsibility
Campus Organizations	Make and maintain contact with campus organizations (HAVOC, HEAG, BSU, etc) concerning their participation in Trust Treat. This job usually requires coordination with Candy and Tourguide/Campus Layout Core.
Candy	This core has the sweet responsibility of buying the candy, making sure it is around for TT, and organizing the distribution of the candy the day of Trust Treat.
Faculty and Staff	This core takes care of keeping contact with any member of the faculty or staff who express and interest in having their child participate in Trust Treat. In the past, this core has helped to organize the kids of this group on the night of Trust Treat and to make sure that everyone was happy.
Private Societies	Contact must be made with the presidents of all the societies to see if they are interested in taking part in this year's Trust Treat. In the past, some of the groups have put on Haunted Houses and may wish to do so again. This core may also have to help the societies find space on campus.
Publicity	Just what it says: working with the Spectator and around the Hill (staff/faculty) to get the word out to the community early and often.
Residence Halls	A key core. We need to know which of the residence halls want to have a candy stop and who in that space will take the responsibility for organizing the event. This takes some coordination with the RA's and the tourguides/campus layout cores.
Tourguides/Campus Layout	Mapping out the campus for the kids and dividing up the volunteers is the main task of this core. It requires a very organized mind or minds.
Transportation	Croghan will take care of this.
Volunteers	Taking the names of volunteers as they come in and making sure that they get to their appropriate cores. At times this core has also been good at keeping contact with the volunteers so that they remember what they volunteered for.
Room Coordinator	This core helps on the night of Trust Treat to greet the kids as they arrive in their individual rooms. These folks also help to get the kids into the groups and out on campus as quickly as possible. In addition, they help keep track of the number of kids who leave and come back to Bristol so the groups leave with the same number of kids as they came with.
