



Hamilton Summer Internship Fund Descriptions as of November 22, 2011

Through the generosity of a number of Hamilton alumni and parents, funding is available to cover cost-of-living expenses to support students who obtain unpaid or minimally paid summer internships. The intent is for students to view this as an opportunity to expand further their educational horizons in preparation for potential careers after graduation. Candidate applications will be reviewed by a selection committee and funding will be awarded from one of the following funds:

<p>The Kevin W. Kennedy '70 Internship for the Arts</p> <p>This fund was established by Amy and John Weinberg to honor Kevin W. Kennedy, studio art major, Class of 1970, upon the occasion of his 60th birthday.</p>	<p>award amount is estimated to be under \$1,500</p> <p>anticipated number of awards: 1-2</p>	<p>Available to sophomores & juniors</p> <p>A brief letter of support from a faculty member in one of the following academic departments who has read your proposal: Art, Art History, Theater or Dance.</p> <p>This fund will provide for individual student internship stipends to help support full-time (at least 240 hours) summer internships in the visual and performing arts, including the studio arts.</p>

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<p>Katherine Eckman '09 Fund</p> <p>This fund was established in 2008 in memory of Katharine Eckman by her family and friends. Katharine passed away after a brief battle with acute leukemia during the fall of her senior year at Hamilton. A psychology major, Katharine was highly interested in politics and public service, and was committed to and passionate about “traditionalist, conservative” ideals.</p>	<p>award amount is estimated to be under \$4,450</p> <p>anticipated number of awards: 1-2</p>	<p>Available to all class years, including graduating seniors if no underclassmen are qualified</p> <p>Candidates must demonstrate academic diligence and financial need, and have an interest in pursuing a career in public policy. The specific internship must be with an organization or elected official that is dedicated to the goals of fostering the economic, political and moral principles that sustain a free and humane society and that emphasizes the responsibility of the individual, rather than government, to be responsible for our society's well-being and success. Such organizations include the Heritage Foundation, the American Enterprise Institute, the Club for Growth, the Federalist Society or the US Chamber of Commerce. The Intercollegiate Studies Institute (ISI), www.isi.org, is a resource students might use to identify internship opportunities that will qualify for funding.</p>
<p>The Christie Bell Vilsack K'72 Internship Award</p> <p>This award was established in 2010 via a gift from Thomas Vilsack '72 in honor of his wife, Christie Bell Vilsack K'72. Initiated upon the occasion of Christie's 60th birthday, this gift serves to recognize and celebrate Christie's ties to College Hill, as well as her long-standing commitment to broadening students' academic experience and opportunities.</p>	<p>award amount is estimated to be \$1,000</p> <p>anticipated number of awards: 1 - 3</p>	<p>Available to freshman, sophomores & juniors</p> <p>This fund will provide support for travel, lodging and meals associated with summer internship opportunities. The intent is to cover reasonable and necessary expenses that would otherwise hamper the student's ability to pursue the internship.</p> <p>The internship opportunity need not be limited to the recipient's proposed or intended area(s) of concentration; rather it is desired for the student to view this as an opportunity to expand further his/her educational horizons.</p>
