Head Coach T.J. Davis

T.J. Davis is leading the Hamilton College men's and women's swimming and diving programs into his 10th season. The men have finished in the top 20 of the NCAA Division III championship team standings four times, while the women have accomplished that feat on four occasions. The highest finish for either team at the NCAA championships under Davis was 14th place by the women in 2003. Davis guided the men to 15th place in 2003 and

2004. At least one Hamilton swimmer or diver has competed in the NCAA championships every year since Davis arrived at Hamilton. Four women's swimmers advanced to the NCAA meet in 2011.

Davis has coached 12 different Hamilton swimmers and divers to a total of 26 All-America awards. One of those athletes is Maggie Rosenbaum '14, who became the College's first national champion in women's swimming at the 2011 NCAA championships. Rosenbaum finished first in the 100-yard backstroke, and picked up two honorable mention All-America awards in the 200 back and as part of the 400 medley relay. Megan Gibbons '12 has four honorable mention All-America awards from the last two national meets.

Todd Johnson '08 earned All-America honors in the 100 back at the 2008 NCAA meet. Diver Mike Salmon '06 won national titles in the 1- and 3-meter springboard at the 2006 NCAA championships. Davis' swimmers and divers have broken 29 different school records. A total of 31 athletes have earned 65 all-conference honors from the New England Small College Athletic Conference (NESCAC) under Davis' tutelage. Johnson captured the NESCAC Four-Year High-Point Swimmer Award after the 2008 conference meet. Davis was voted the Liberty League men's and women's coach of the year after the 2003 and 2007 championship meets.

Davis was the head coach at Alfred University from 1996 to 2002. While at Alfred, he coached 29 All-Americans, led the men's team to 15th place at the 2000 NCAA Division III championship, and was named the New York State Women's Collegiate Athletic Association's coach of the year in 2002. Davis was an assistant coach at the University of Rochester (1995-96) and at Union College (1993-95). He has been a member of the American Swimming Coaches Association and the College Swimming Coaches Association since 1993.

Davis' athletes excel in the classroom as well. Seven swimmers and divers were on the 2010-11 NESCAC winter all-academic team, and a men's swimmer was valedictorian of the Class of 2004. In the 2008 fall semester, Hamilton recorded the highest team grade point average of any Division III women's program, according to the College Swimming Coaches Association of America (CSCAA). The women have consistently been ranked in the top 15 and the men are routinely in the top 20 in the CSCAA ranking of team GPA for Division III programs.

Davis, who hails from Norwich, N.Y., graduated with a bachelor's degree from the University at Albany in 1993. He earned a master's in teaching from Union in 1995. Davis and his wife Marieke (Kearns) reside in Clinton.

Assistant Coach Michele Comerota

Michele Comerota is in her first season as an assistant coach for the Hamilton College swimming and diving programs. Comerota was a four-year letter winner at Southwestern University in Georgetown, Texas, from 2007 to 2011.

Most recently, Comerota served as the co-head coach for the Teal Run Tidalwaves club team in Fresno, Texas. She was responsible for the development and training of swimmers ages 5 to 18.

Comerota was a co-captain for the Southwestern women's swim team. She is part of a 400-yard freestyle relay that set a program record in 2011.

Comerota also enjoyed success in the classroom, as she was named to the Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference Academic Honor Roll each year from 2009 to 2011. She was named to the Southwestern Athletic Director's Honor Roll in 2009 and 2010.

Comerota earned a bachelor's degree from Southwestern in 2011. She attended L.V. Hightower High School in Missouri City, Texas.

Diving Coach Jim Ray

Jim Ray is in his eighth season as the diving coach at Hamilton College. Ray helped guide Mike Salmon '06 to national titles in the 1- and 3-meter springboard events at the 2006 NCAA Division III championship. He was named a New England Small College Athletic Conference (NESCAC) men's diving coach of the year in 2006 after Salmon won both diving events at the NESCAC championship. Diane Paverman '13 set a women's team record for most points in the 1-meter board under Ray's tutelage in 2010.

Ray has been coaching since 1977. He developed the U.S. Diving Club at Hamilton the past eight years and has utilized several methods of technological advancement to train his divers. He was also the diving coach at local power New Hartford High School in 2003. The entire team qualified for the sectional championships, where two divers placed in the top 10.

Ray coached state high school champions in Hawaii and New Hampshire. He has attended a number of clinics during his career and is a certified swimming and diving official through the National Federation of High Schools and the NCAA.

Volunteer Asst. Coach Tom Wells

Tom Wells is in his sixth season as an assistant coach with the Hamilton College swimming and diving programs. Wells continues to enjoy a successful career as the New Hartford Senior High School girls' head swim coach. His teams have captured 11 Section III titles and 12 New York State Class B championships.

Wells serves as the Empire State Games Central Region director for swimming, the Section III high school swim chairman and head coach of New Hartford Aquatics. Wells served as New Hartford's head track and field coach for 43 years. His teams produced six Section III championships and won 329 dual meets. His track responsibilities include assistant coordinator of New York State Boys' Track and a 25-year stint as the Section III chair for boys' track.

Wells retired from his position as New Hartford physical education teacher after 37 years. He graduated from Springfield College with a bachelor's degree in 1966, and earned a master's degree from Syracuse University in 1971. The New Hartford resident has two grown children, Stacy and Jim. Stacy was a former swimmer at Syracuse University and Jim was an All-American swimmer at the University of Southern California.

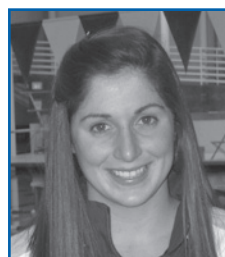

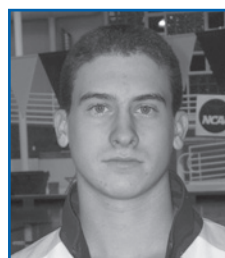

Women's Program Overview

Before last season, 20 Hamilton College women's swimmers and divers had earned All-America recognition, and a number of others had received honorable mention All-America awards. But no Hamilton women's swimmer had captured a national title by winning an event at the NCAA Division III championships until **Maggie Rosenbaum '14** finished first in the 100-yard backstroke as a rookie at the 2011 national meet. Rosenbaum picked up an honorable mention All-America award for the 200 back, and was part of an honorable mention All-America 400 medley relay. **Megan Gibbons '12**, who owns four honorable mention All-America awards, and **Joan Burton '13** were part of that relay. The record-breaking trio leads all returners in 2011-12. Gibbons, **Lizzy Buhl '12**, **Jeannie Folan '12** and **Gabrielle Goione '12** are the team captains and comprise the squad's Class of 2012.

Gibbons, Burton, Rosenbaum and Liz Bucceri '11 were responsible for setting team records in the 200 and 400 medley relay, and 400 and 800 freestyle relay in 2011. They finished second in the consolation final at last year's NCAA championships, and led the Continentals to 20th place in the team standings at the conclusion of the meet.

Gibbons has competed on the national stage each of the past two seasons. She holds program records in the 50, 100 and 200 free. She finished fifth in the 50 free consolation finals and tied for seventh in the 100 free conso finals at the 2011 NCAA meet. She made the 2010-11 New England Small College Athletic Conference (NESCAC) all-conference team for the 50 and 100 free by finishing in the top three at the conference championship. It was the second straight year she made the NESCAC all-conference team.

Rosenbaum followed in the footsteps of older sister Whitney '10, who competed for Hamilton in the 2009 and 2010 NCAA championships. Maggie finished second in the 200 back consolation finals to go with her 100 back victory at the 2011 national meet. She already holds the program records in all three backstroke distances. Her performance at the 2011 NESCAC championship was nothing short of amazing as she finished first in the 50, 100 and 200 back, and made the all-conference team. She set a meet record in the 50 and Williams College pool records in all three events.

Diane Paverman '13 set a team record for points in the 1-meter springboard as a first-year diver in 2010. Paverman just missed all-conference honors in the 1-meter board (fourth place), and ended up seventh in the 3-meter at the NESCAC championship in 2010. She was sixth in the 1-meter and eighth in the 3-meter at the 2011 conference meet.

The program's first All-American was Cathy Imboden in 1982. Diver Cady Kashner '03 was the 2003 national champion in the 1-meter board. Hamilton has scored points at the NCAA championships 19 times since 1982. The Continentals' best showing at the national championships was 10th place with 119 points in 2000. Both Meghan Steed '00 and Liz Sichel '96 collected All-America honors three out of four years during their collegiate careers. Prior to Rosenbaum, the most recent All-American was breaststroke specialist Brittany Achin '05 in 2005.

Hamilton competes in the NESCAC championship every February. All-American Nicole Knapp '05 earned all-NESCAC honors in four events and Achin was recognized in three events at the 2005 championship. The NESCAC championship is one of the fastest Division III meets in the nation prior to the NCAA meet. Four NESCAC teams placed in the top 20 at the 2011 NCAA championships.

Buhl, Folan, Holly Donaldson '11, Leigh Ercole '11 and **Megan Schlosser '13** made the 2010-11 NESCAC winter all-academic team. Liz Rabe '04 and Sarah McDermott '04 were elected to the Epsilon chapter of Phi Beta Kappa, which is the nation's oldest and most prestigious honor society, in 2003-04.

Men's Program Overview

Tom Cyran '12 and **Taylor Hogenkamp '13** lead Hamilton College men's swimming and diving into 2011-12. The duo joined forces with Jake DeConinck '11 and Bowie Sievers '11 to earn 2010-11 New England Small College Athletic Conference (NESCAC) all-conference honors for the 800-yard freestyle relay. They finished third in the event at the 2011 NESCAC championship. Hogenkamp is a two-time all-conference honoree for the 800 free relay, and **Ian Nichols '13** made the 2009-10 all-NESCAC team for the 50 breaststroke. Cyran, **James Crafa '12**, **Jon Fung '12** and Hogenkamp are the team captains.

Hogenkamp finished fifth in the 100 free and seventh in the 200 free at the 2011 NESCAC championship. Cyran ended up 10th in the 1,000 free and 12th in the 1,650 free at the same meet. Nichols set the school record in the 50 breast with a time of 26.60 seconds at the 2010 NESCAC championship.

Hamilton finished fifth out of 11 teams at the 2010 NESCAC championship -- the best performance for the Continentals at the competitive event since 2005. Sievers, who was a three-time all-conference performer and 2009 NCAA Division III championships participant, led Hamilton at the 2010 conference meet. Sievers set a school record in the 400 individual medley at the 2009 NESCAC championship.

The program's first All-Americans were Rick Volp '69 and Bruce Mohl '68 in 1967. Mohl was a national champion in the 200 backstroke in 1967, and in the 400 IM in 1968. Jeff Carlberg '75 added national titles in the 100 breast in 1974 and 1975. A total of 39 athletes have earned All-America recognition and a number of others have received honorable mention All-America awards. Todd Johnson '08 is the most recent All-American as he finished eighth in the finals of the 100 back at the 2008 NCAA championships. The Continentals scored at least one point at the national meet from 1992 to 2008. The team's best showing at the championships was eighth place in 1975 and 2000.

Mike Salmon (2003-06), Brian Hogan (1975-78) and Norman Lyster (1978-81) are the only Continentals to capture All-America honors all four years at Hamilton. Five others (Carlberg, Jonathan Greene '95, Anthony Loeffler '01, D.J. Postles '00, Volp) were All-Americans three out of four years. Salmon -- a diver -- enjoyed one of the most decorated seasons by a Hamilton athlete his senior year. He won all 16 events in which he competed and capped the season with titles in the 1- and 3-meter springboard at the 2006 NCAA championships. He was the obvious choice for NCAA Division III diver of the year based on that performance. Salmon was named NESCAC diver of the year for the third straight season. He broke his own 3-meter school record at the 2006 NCAA meet, and holds school and NESCAC records for the 1-meter board. Salmon earned a total of seven All-America awards during his brilliant career.

Hamilton competes in the NESCAC championship in February. Johnson picked up the NESCAC Four-Year High-Point Swimmer Award at the conclusion of the 2008 meet. The NESCAC event is one of the fastest Division III meets in the nation prior to the NCAA championships. Five NESCAC teams placed in the top 25 at the 2011 national meet.

Mike Salmon was selected to the 2006 Academic All-America men's at-large second team by the College Sports Information Directors of America. Jim Baker '04 was valedictorian of his graduating class. Fung and Chris DeConinck '11 made the 2010-11 NESCAC winter all-academic team.

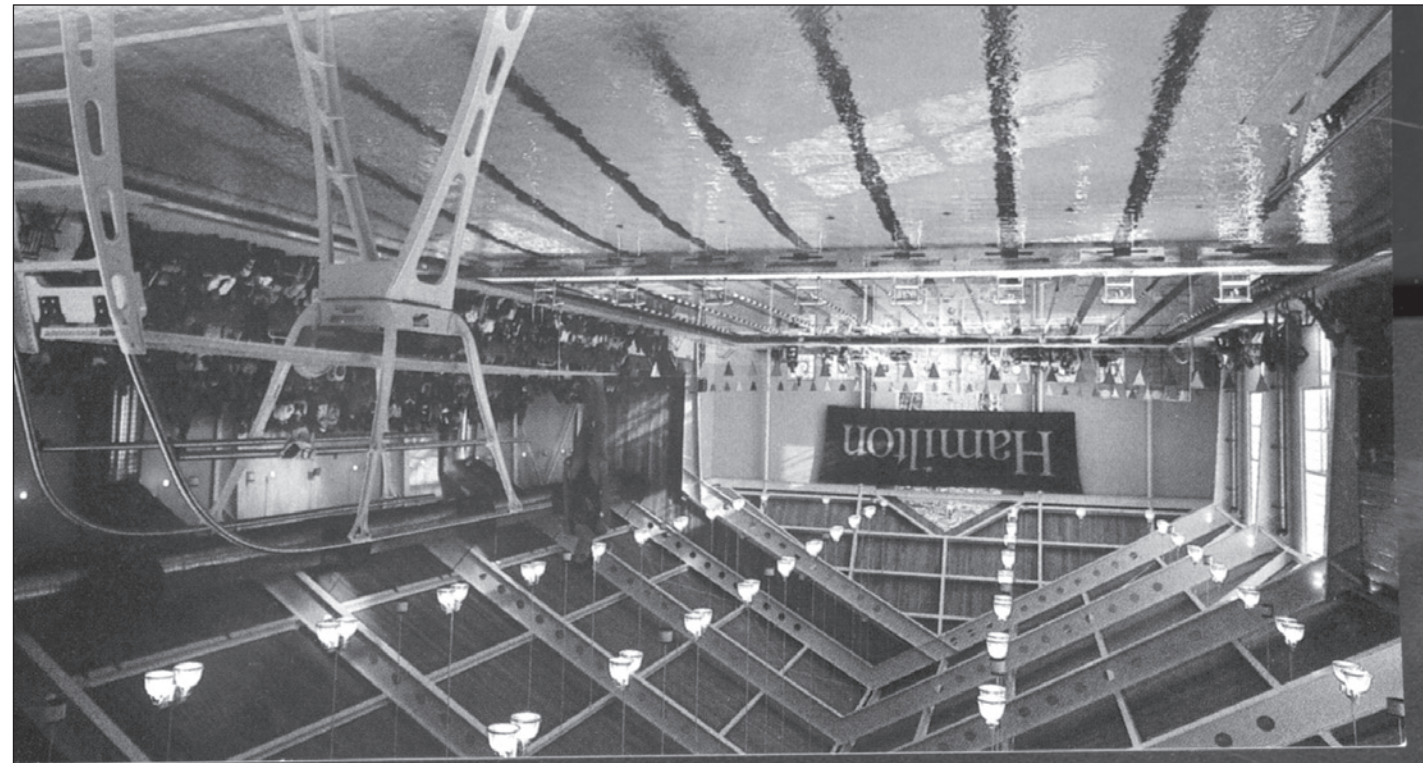

Opened in 2006, the Charlean and Wayland Blood Fitness and Dance Center includes a large, glass-enclosed aerobic/cardio training area that overlooks Steuben Field; two rooms for resistance and weight-training; a three-story, 39-foot climbing wall; a dance studio that can be transformed in 10 minutes from working studio to performance space; a café/lounge bar; and a multipurpose room. Spinning classes are held on a group of bikes located on the second level cardio mezzanine overlooking the main aerobic/cardio area.

* Hamilton sponsors 28 varsity teams that compete at the NCAA Division III level.

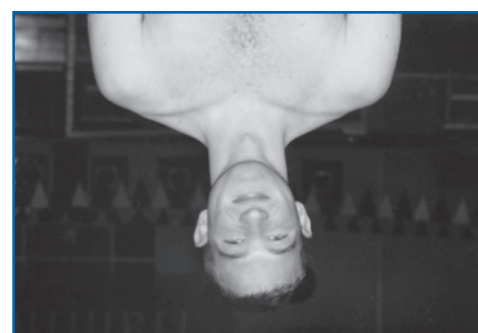
