

Head Coach Erin Glaser



Erin Glaser is in her fourth year as the head women's volleyball coach at Hamilton College. In 2010, Glaser guided Hamilton to 13 victories, which marked the team's highest total since 1999.

The Continentals defeated Colby College in October for their first New England Small College Athletic Conference (NESCAC) win since 2007. Hamilton led the NESCAC in service aces, and one player ranked fourth in hitting percentage under Glaser in 2010. She mentored Amber O'Connor '09 as O'Connor set a team record with 596 digs in 2008.

Glaser's program was honored by the American Volleyball Coaches Association with the AVCA Team Academic Award for 2008-09. A 3.30 cumulative team grade point average on a 4.0 scale, or a 4.10 GPA on a 5.0 scale, needs to be maintained at the close of the school year for a program to be eligible for the award. One student-athlete made the 2010 NESCAC fall all-academic team. Each honoree has a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.35 and must have reached junior academic standing at her institution.

Glaser -- formerly Erin Reding -- was an assistant coach at Connecticut College in 2006 and 2007. The Camels tied for second in the 2006 NESCAC standings with a record of 7-3, and the team was 20-9 overall. Glaser helped guide the team to a tie for third place with another 7-3 conference record -- and an overall record of 20-8 -- in 2007. Conn. College was a NESCAC championship semifinalist both years. She helped mold two all-conference selections during those two years.

Glaser played volleyball at Wesleyan University for four years. She was a co-captain and team MVP as a senior in 2005, and was selected the team's rookie of the year in 2002. Glaser led the Cardinals in blocks as a sophomore, junior and senior. She finished second on the program's all-time list with 415 blocks. Glaser also ended up fifth in career aces (221) and seventh in kills (1,137). She graduated cum laude from Wesleyan with a bachelor's degree in art history in 2006.

Glaser attended Darien High School in Darien, Conn., where she was co-captain of the varsity team in 2002. She helped lead the squad to the Class M Connecticut state title and a county championship.

The ACR is a not-for-profit 501(c)3 organization and was founded in 1983. Its mission is three-fold: Prevent the spread of HIV and other sexually transmitted diseases; provide support services to those who are living with HIV/AIDS; and promote sexual literacy and improved medical outcomes. The event was a 5K fundraising walk on the beautiful Hamilton College campus and 100 percent fundraised dollars stayed in the Mohawk Valley.

The team was very excited to be a part of the event. Much of the Hamilton community (students, employees and staff) showed up for the hike, including many local organizations. To date, the hike raised more than \$8,300 for the ACR and the Hamilton women's volleyball team raised more than \$1,650 of that total!

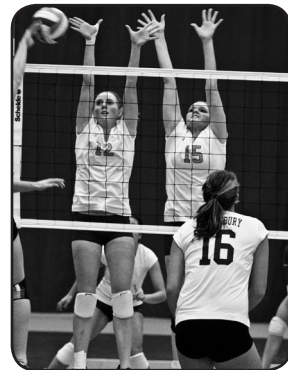

Blood Fitness Center



Opened in 2006, the Charlean and Wayland Blood Fitness and Dance Center includes a large, glass-enclosed aerobic/cardio training area that overlooks Steuben Field; two rooms for resistance and weight-training; a three-story, 39-foot climbing wall; a dance studio that can be transformed in 10 minutes from working studio to performance space; a café/juice bar; and a multipurpose room. Spinning classes are held on a group of bikes located on the second level cardio mezzanine overlooking the main aerobic/cardio area.

About the NESCAC

Founded in 1971, the New England Small College Athletic Conference (NESCAC) is a group of eleven highly selective liberal arts colleges and universities that share a similar philosophy for intercollegiate athletics. The Conference was created out of a concern for the direction of intercollegiate athletic programs, and remains committed to keeping a proper perspective on the role of sport in higher education.

The formation of NESCAC originated with an agreement among Amherst College, Bowdoin College, Wesleyan University and Williams College first drafted in 1955. Along with these four institutions, Bates College, Colby College, Hamilton College, Middlebury College, Trinity College and Tufts University are sustaining charter members. Connecticut College joined in 1982, bringing the Conference's membership to its current total of 11 institutions.

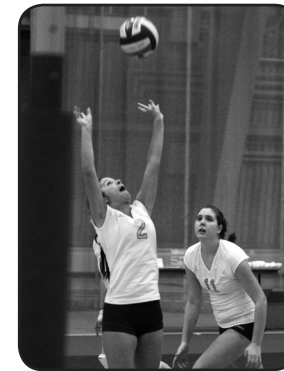
NESCAC members believe intercollegiate athletic programs should operate in harmony with the educational mission of each institution. The Conference is committed to establishing common boundaries to keep athletics strong but in proportion to the overall academic mission of the member institutions. In pursuit of this mission, the Presidents of each NESCAC institution control intercollegiate athletic policy. Conference tenets are usually more restrictive than those of the NCAA Division III with regard to season length, number of contests and post-season competition.

NESCAC institutions also believe athletic teams should be representative of the entire student body. Thus, admissions and financial policies are consistent with the NCAA Division III policies that prohibit athletic scholarships and award financial aid solely on the basis of need.

In 1999, the NESCAC formally became a playing conference and now sponsors 26 conference championship sports (13 for men and 13 for women). Member schools offer extensive and broad based intercollegiate as well as club and intramural opportunities for both men and women. With member institutions sponsoring an average of nearly 30 varsity programs, NESCAC provides more than 7,500 opportunities for participation in intercollegiate competition at the Division III level. Teams and individuals have achieved great success on both a regional and national level. During the 2009-10 academic year, 52 teams participated in NCAA team championships. NESCAC student-athletes claimed 17 individual national championships and NESCAC teams won six national team championships.

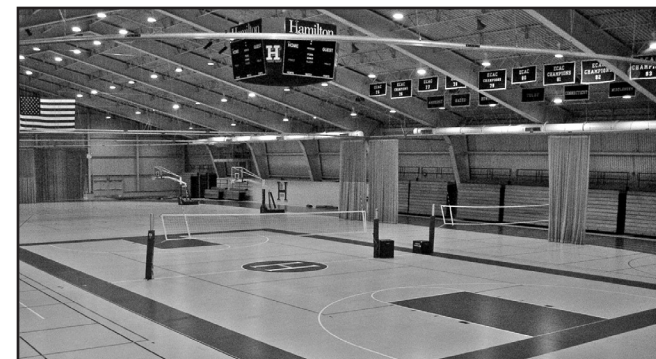

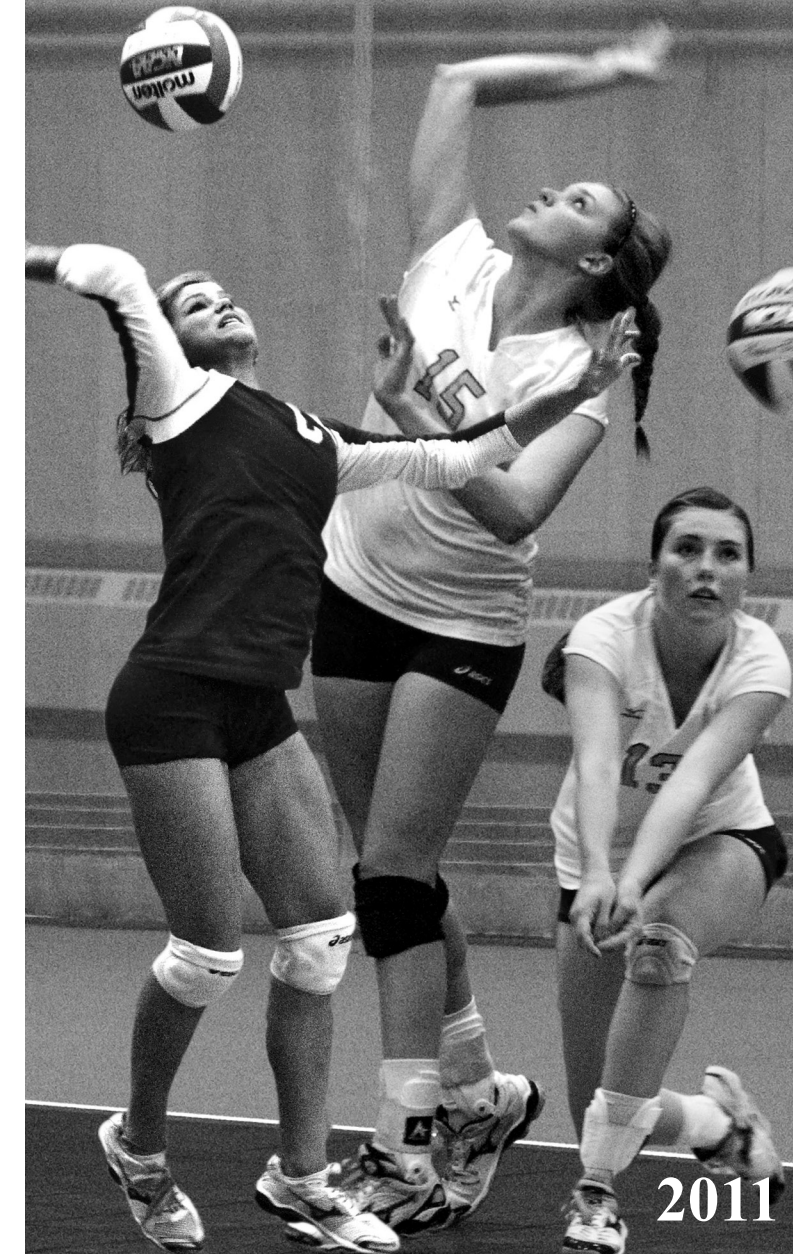
