Based on their responses to these questions, respondents could score anywhere from 5 to 12 points, with 5 being the most engaged in politics and 12 being the least engaged in politics.

Civics included those respondents who scored 5 or 6. This included 83 respondents or 20.5 % of the sample.

Disengaged included those who scored 9 or more. This included 90 respondents or 22.4 % of the sample.
