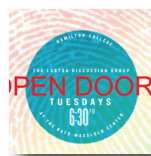
Tuesday the 8th Days-Massolo Center Open House 4:15 p.m. // Days-Massolo Center

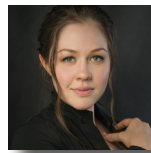

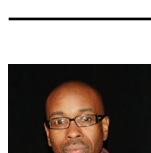
Monday the 21st Empowerment thru Employment 4:00 p.m. // The Red Pit
