

**Hands on Hamilton History**

Please join us October 20 at 10am and 2pm in the Patricia Pogue Couper Research Room on the 3rd floor of Burke Library. The exhibit will include documents regarding Baron Von Steuben, Samuel Kirkland, and the Revolutionary War, and the Hamilton-Oneida Academy. Visitors will be allowed to get up close to the artifacts and even handle some of them. The next day these items will be installed in the display cases in the first floor of Burke Library.

**Samuel Kirkland Artifacts on Display**

Samuel Kirkland (1741-1808) was a missionary to the Oneida Indians. In 1793 he founded the Hamilton-Oneida Academy, a school for the joint education of Iroquois and white youth. On display in Burke Library, this collection of manuscripts, letters and personal effects gathers some of the few remaining artifacts of the Reverend Kirkland, as well as books that he owned while preaching in the wilderness of upstate New York.
