




**Welcome Back!**

Nearly 500 British periodicals published from the 17th through the early 20th centuries. Topics covered include literature, philosophy, history, science, music, art, drama, archaeology, architecture, and the social sciences.

Over 560 journals have been added to Hamilton's JSTOR collection. Includes journals in art & art history, classics, economics, education, history, language & literature, linguistics, music, philosophy, political science and area studies, and religion. Of particular note are important literary reviews and state historical titles, and rare 19th and early 20th century American Art periodicals from the Frick, the Met, and the Brooklyn Museum.

**Hands on Hamilton History**

Please join us September 22nd at 10am and 2pm in the Patricia Pogue Couper Rare Book Room on the 3rd floor of Burke Library, as we begin our monthly series of bicentennial displays. Our kickoff event will feature documents and personal effects of Samuel Kirkland.

The exhibit will include documents from the Samuel Kirkland Papers, pewter and china that belonged to Kirkland, a ledger in which he kept accounts, and one or two of his books.

Each month Archivist Katherine Collett and Director of Special Collections Christian Goodwillie will assemble a small group of documents, artifacts, and visual materials relating to a specific period in the history of Hamilton College. A brief discussion of these materials will happen in the Rare Book Room at 10 am and 2 pm on the fourth Thursday of each month. Visitors will be allowed to get up close to the artifacts and even handle some of them. The next day these items will be installed in the display cases in the first floor of Burke Library.


