Spring 2012 Summary of Code of Student Conduct Violations and Sanctions

Not Responsible:

• 14 students were found not responsible at the conclusion of their judicial hearing.

One Judicial Point:

- Five students received one point each for possession of an open container of alcohol in a public area.
- One student received one point for a noise police violation.

Two Judicial Points:

- One student received two points for smoking in a residence hall room
- Eight students received two points each for underage possession of alcohol
- Nine students received two points each for disruptive behavior in a residence hall
- One student received two points for urinating in public on campus
- Two students received two points each for engaging in intimate relations in an academic space.
- One student received two points for being disruptive at a local restaurant.
- Two students received two points each for entering a locked campus facility without authorization.

Three Judicial Points:

- Two students received three points each for possession of alcohol and violation of the bulk alcohol policy.
- One student received three points for a noise policy violation and failure to comply with a college official.
- Three students receive three points each for unauthorized entry into a campus facility.
- One student received three points for urinating in public in the Village of Clinton.
- Six students received three points each for providing alcohol to minors.

Four Judicial Points:

- Two underage students received four points each for possession of an open container of alcohol and failure to comply with campus safety.
- Two students received four points each for damaging college property.
- Three students received four points each for violation of fire safety policies.
- Two students received four points each for disruptive behavior (streaking).
- One student received four points for reckless driving on campus.
- One student received four points for possession of marijuana.

- One student received four points for possession and attempted use of a false ID.
- One student received four points for disruptive behavior and possession of alcohol under 21.
- One student received four points for unauthorized entry into a college facility.

Five Judicial Points:

- One student received five points for disruptive behavior and failure to comply with Campus Safety.
- Three students received five points for possession of marijuana and drug paraphernalia.
- Five students received five points each for possession of hard alcohol under the age of 21.

Six Judicial Points:

- One student received six points for possession of alcohol under the age of 21 and possession of marijuana.
- One student received six points for possession marijuana and disruptive behavior.

Seven Judicial Points:

• One student received seven points for possession of marijuana and possession of alcohol under 21.

Ten Judicial Points:

- One student received ten points and was suspended for disruptive behavior and possession of a false ID at a Hamilton College sporting event at another college.
- One student received ten points and was suspended for unauthorized purchases using other student's Hill Cards.
